## Evaluating a Children's Book for Bias

What to look for:	Details	Notes
Stereotypes	An oversimplified generalization about a group that creates the idea we know something about the person based on their perceived membership in the group.	
Tokenism	Regularly seeing only <b>one</b> of any group either in the characters in the story or in the selection of books in a collection.	
Storyline	<ul> <li>Are people of color passive or "doers"?</li> <li>Who causes problems?</li> <li>Who resolves them?</li> <li>What does a character have to do to gain acceptance?</li> </ul>	
Lifestyles	<ul><li>Are people of color depicted as poor or otherwise unfavorable?</li><li>Negative value judgements?</li><li>Diversity within a group?</li></ul>	
Relationships	<ul> <li>What is the balance of power between the characters?</li> <li>Who are the central and supporting characters?</li> <li>Are a variety of family types depicted?</li> </ul>	
Heroes	<ul><li>Whose interest are they serving?</li><li>What do the heroes look like?</li><li>Are the heroes real people?</li></ul>	
Identity	<ul> <li>Can children see themselves reflected in the literature?</li> <li>Can children identify with the characters in a positive way?</li> </ul>	
Author's background or perspective	<ul> <li>When was the book published?</li> <li>What is the author's attitude toward the story and characters?</li> <li>Do the images reflect respect and accuracy?</li> </ul>	
Loaded words	Does the language carry offensive overtones?	

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
