





Circus Mirandus by Cassie Beasley


Before the Ever After by Jacqueline Woodson


Fifty-Four Things Wrong with Gwendolyn Rogers by Caela



Frizzy by Claribel A. Ortega and Rose Bousamra





Eight-year-old J.D. turns a tragic home haircut into a thriving barber business in this hilarious new illustrated chapter book series


Just Jerry: How Drawing Shaped My Life by Jerry Pinkney

The Name of This Book Is Secret by Pseudonymous Bosch



REALISTIC FICTION




If you want to get to know eleven-year-old Samantha Ali-O'Connor, you need to know three things:

Two, she and Harbor always compete with each other to be the best Oldest Sibling—and just about everything else.


And three, she is determined to prove she's a real Ali-O'Connor by taking over the family business, repairing and chartering boats.

A few days before his birthday, Finn learns that the women of his family are time travelers and they expect him to help locate his missing mother.


